The Folkestone Education Committee has approved a plan for two or three “Folkestone Reads a Book” programs each year. The format will follow the pattern established last November when Folkestone read Norman Maclean’s *A River Runs Through it*, watched the film version of the novel, and then heard a presentation by Mark Schwehn on both the book and movie.

The first installment of the 2024 series will feature Harper Lee’s *To Kill A Mockingbird* with the presentation by Mark Schwehn on Thursday, May 23rd, at 2:00pm in the Theater. The Film version of the novel will be shown during the previous week on May 16th and May 21st. Twelve copies of the book, placed in a basket in the library, are now available for borrowing.
