came to the U.S in 1962 after a few detours. Germany is my home country, and still would be, if I hadn't answered an ad in a German magazine. That ad had been placed by a young German fellow who had left Germany for Canada, and wanted a pen pal. I answered this ad Christmas 1958. His reply came a few weeks later and we corresponded throughout 1959. He got on a boat to visit me in Paris where I was working at that time.



Before he had to return to Canada, we spent some time in Berlin where we got engaged. We got married in March in Unna. In August, I got on a boat ending up in Montreal. We lived in Port Arthur until March 1962. A stroke of luck made it possible for us to immigrate to the U.S. A soccer team from Minneapolis came to Port Arthur to play against a Canadian team. The coach from that team offered my husband to sponsor us to come to Minneapolis if he would play for his team. Hurrah! The American Dream had materialized.

My German high school had taught me English spelling and grammar. I learned to speak the language while in Canada, so when I arrived in the U.S I was able to hold a job. I found a job at Pillsbury where I worked until we returned to Germany in 1970. We spent three years in the old country until our return to Minnesota. My husband was employed by Sperry Univac and traveled extensively installing and repairing computers. In 1980, I started my last job in the 3M Tax Division and finally retired in 1996.

In 1977, we moved to Scandia, Minn. where we had bought a 30-acre farm. When my husband's health deteriorated we sold the farm and moved to Waverly Gardens where we stayed for three years. My husband passed away in January 2022.

In March I moved to Germany to live with my daughter and family for 18 months. I returned in Minnesota in November 2023 and settled in at Harbor Crossing.
